Welcome to the ECA Guidance Office's list of scholarships. The majority of the scholarships listed are unique to Clark County, so be sure to apply! Check the entire document for new scholarships because they are not listed in chronological order.

Please know that I update the list each time I receive new information concerning a scholarship. Instead of listing only the available scholarships, I list the entire year's list to allow you to plan ahead and know when future deadlines are approaching.

I use the following coloring system to help you with your scholarship search:

Dark Red – The deadline has passed.

Green – The deadline is approaching.

Yellow – The deadline is close!

White – The scholarship information has not yet arrived. **Please do not ask Mr. Wynn for that scholarship information until he receives it.** Thank you!

If a scholarship needs a transcript, please turn in a yellow Transcript Request form to Mr. Wynn in the guidance office. Allow at least a week for transcripts to be sent and received by scholarship committees. Give teachers and other adults two weeks or more to write a letter of recommendation. Be sure to give them a self-addressed envelope with postage as well!

Finally, I've made every effort to display scholarship information accurately and completely. However, sponsoring organizations may have changed policies, awards, deadlines, or requirements since supplying their information. For the most up-to-date information, please contact the scholarship program before applying. Thank you!

Happy hunting! Remember, taking an hour to fill out a scholarship application is worth it! Sometimes free money takes a little bit of work!

Mr. Wynn's Tips

- With all scholarship searches and applications, talk with your parents before giving personal information.
- You should never have to pay an application fee for a scholarship or a search fee for possible scholarships!
- Legitimate businesses will list methods for contacting them beyond an e-mail address and PO Box. If you can't talk to them, they may not exist as a real business.
- Read the Federal Trade Commission's pamphlet to receive tips on how to avoid scholarship scams. It is titled: "Ouch! Students Getting Stung Trying to Find \$\$\$ for College" <http://www.ftc.gov/bcp/edu/pubs/consumer/alerts/alt009.pdf>
- Notify Mr. Wynn if you are the recipient of any scholarships or financial aid.
- Write down usernames and passwords from scholarships and scholarship searches and keep them in a safe place. Try and keep all of the information in one location, such as leaving it near your computer at home.
- Consider this when applying for a scholarship: If you spend an hour writing an essay for a \$1,000 scholarship it is worth it! I would say that is a pretty good hour's work!
- Be creative in your search for scholarships. Check your grocery items, favorite stores and websites, community businesses, etc.
- Ask for transcripts and letters of recommendation a few weeks before a deadline. It reflects poorly on you if you wait until the last minute.
- Have a teacher, family member, mentor and/or friend read over your applications and essays to search for errors.
- Be sure to look for and understand the reason why a scholarship is being offered. Tailor your essay to address these key issues.
- Be creative and re-use essays for multiple scholarships! Be sure to revise and edit the essay to fit the scholarship's requirements.
- Be willing to put in the time and effort needed to effectively search and apply for scholarships. It will be worth it!
